

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

PACKARD PLA-WOR REMOTE CONTROL

MODEL 30-200

- 1. Unlock and remove cover of the box. Remove the left knob and guide arm. Remove and discard the cable hole cover plate on the bottom or back of the box.
- Mount the wall box securely in the desired location leaving a free space at the left rear bottom corner of the box for entry of the 30 pair cables.
- 3. Loosen the outside nut on the 24 numbered stude on the circular bakelite terminal strip. Also loosen the nuts on the terminals designated #1, 3 and 4 on Fig. 1.
- 4. Measure the 30 pair cables to allow about 13 inches to protrude through the cable channel. Carefully strip about 12 inches of the outer cable covering avoiding cutting into the wires or disturbing their arrangement. Feed the stripped cable ends through the cable channel.
- 5. Refer to the color code chart and separate from each cable the wires from numbers 1 to 13 and 14 to 24. Form these wires neatly so that wires from both cables for numbers 1 to 13 go up and around the terminal strip on the outside of the studs and wires for 14 to 24 go down and around the terminal strip.
- 6. In each cable there is one red wire, one black wire (stranded) and one black and white wire (stranded). Form all six of these wires to run upward to the terminals #1, 3, and 4. The two black wires go to terminal #3, the two black and white wires to terminal #4 and the two red wires to terminal #1. Cut and form these wires so as to make a small loop before fastening them under the washer and nut.
- 7. In each cable there are three extra wires for which there is no color code designation. Form these three wires from one cable with the upward branch and form the other cable with the downward branch.
- 8. Start with the orange brown wires for #13 stud in the top branch and bring them out of the back of the cable and wind them for several turns around the other wires. Carefully strip the insulation without nicking the wire and fasten them under the washer and nut. Continue in this fashion around to stud #1. Repeat this procedure for the bottom branch of the cable starting with the orange slate wires for #14. The three extra wires in each branch should be doubled back and carefully formed behind the other wires.
- 9. Figure 2 shows a properly wired box. Notice the ample leads that have been left to each screw by going from behind and winding around the other wires as directed. This allows sufficient wire to make repairs in case a wire is broken. Notice also that if formed properly the cable will lay flat on the drum cast-

ing and will not protrude above the casting at any point. When the guide arm is replaced it should not pinch the cable at any point.

SERVICE INSTRUCTION

- Each Packard wall box is adjusted and thoroughly tested and inspected at the factory before being shipped. Except for damage by acts of vandalism, the box will give reliable service indefinitely.
- The proper adjustment of the two sets of contacts is illustrated in Fig. 3.
- 3. The contact springs should never be bent without the use of a tool such as shown on Fig. 3 or by the carful use of a pair of long nose pliers. Avoid making sharp bends or twists of any kind in the contact springs. If the position of the top of the interrupter arm is such that the contact springs will be thrown considerably out of line, the arm should be bent forward or back as required to give a better line up before adjusting the contacts.
- 4. It is recommended that no attempt be made to adjust the slug rejector. An occasional failure to function properly on a bonafide nickel is inevitable considering the condition of wear of some coins. It is not feasible to adjust the slug rejector to take all coins and at the same time retain protection against slugs. Most causes of trouble can be cleared by a thorough cleaning of the rejector with carbon tetrachloride. The magnets may be cleaned by removing the brass cylinder nut holding one magnet and wiping both magnets clean of all dirt and iron particles. Under no circumstance should oil or any other lubricant be used on any part of the slug rejector. It is important for proper functioning of the slug rejector that the box be mounted in a level, vertical position.
- 5. The slug rejector assembly may be removed without removing the drum by taking out the two screws marked X on Fig. 4, removing the coin switch guard and sliding the lamp off of the lamp bracket inside the drum. The rejector may then be lifted and pivoted on the connecting wires. For complete removal, disconnect the wires at the four connection terminal board.
- 6. If the left and right brackets are removed from the slug rejector the following procedure must be used in re-assembly to avoid putting the rejector under a strain which will interfere with its operation. Mount the left bracket first, making sure that the edge of the slug rejector is even with the mounting lip of the bracket. When the proper position is obtained set the mounting screws tight. Next mount the right bracket to the slug rejector but do not tighten the mounting screws. Place the assembly in the box and fasten down tight with the two screws X, Fig. 4. Then the screw or screws fastening the right bracket to the slug rejector may be set tight. Note that the screw at the top of the right bracket is only 1/8 inch long. If a longer

screw is used in this position it will interfere with the operation of the slug rejector.

- 7. Mounting the box on an uneven surface without the use of a flat board will spring the back of the box when the mounting screws are pulled down tight which may put a strain on the slug rejector and cause failure to operate properly. If this condition is unavoidable, the strain may be relieved by loosening and then re-tightening the screw or screws mounting the right bracket to the slug rejector after all other screws are set tight.




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


CONTACT SPRING BENDING TOOL COIN SWITCH ADJUSTMENT







Any number of boxes can be playing at once but each one requires a 5e or 10e deposit.




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
